

Temporary Rent Assistance Benefit

Rent support for Albertans with low- to moderate-income



Overview

Albertans who are between jobs or having a hard time making ends meet may qualify for the Temporary Rent Assistance Benefit.



Details

- Available in more than 80 communities, including Alberta's seven major centres and most surrounding communities.
- Assistance is provided on a first come, first served basis.
- Amount calculated based on household size and location; will be reduced in the second year.
- Two-year cap; eligibility is reassessed after the first year; households can reapply for rent assistance at the end of two years.
- Minimum benefit is \$100 per month



Eligibility

- Households are eligible if they:
- Have an income that is less than the local income threshold (see Table 1)
 - are employed or have been employed in the last 24 months
 - are not receiving social assistance, including:
 - Income Support
 - Learner Income Support
 - Assured Income for the Severely Handicapped (AISH)
 - Alberta Seniors Benefit
 - Guaranteed Income Supplement
